## Man Is Charged in His Girlfriend's

MOUNT HOLLY, N.J., Nov. 25  
(AP) — A man fatally stabbed his  
estranged girlfriend, telephoned her  
mother to say he was going to marry  
the corpse and then drove to West  
Virginia where he was captured, the  
authorities said today.

The man, Forrest D. Fuller, of  
Pemberton Township, N.J., was ar-  
rested in the Last Stop bar in Fair-  
mont, W. Va., on Thursday after  
told a barmaid that his friend  
was outside in Burlington County Pro-  
fice.

Authorities found the  
corpse of his girlfriend, Jodie  
wrapped in blankets in the rear  
of her 1994 Chevrolet Camaro,  
Sergeant Smith. A wedding dr-

was in the trunk.  
Mr. Fuller, 28, was being held  
without bond in the Marion County  
jail pending extradition to New Jersey, Sheriff Ron Watkins said.

## Teen-Ager Is Sentenced in Mother's Killing

STEUBENVILLE, Ohio, Oct. 3  
(AP) — A 16-year-old convicted of  
killing his mother by shooting her in  
the head with arrows was sentenced  
on Monday to 15 years to life in  
prison.

The youth, Brian Nemeth, was  
convicted on Saturday of murdering  
Suzanne Nemeth, 40, on Jan. 7, while  
she slept on a couch in their home in  
Wintersville, a village just east of  
Steubenville in eastern Ohio. She  
died eight days later. The authorities  
said he shot five arrows into her  
head and neck.

Mr. Nemeth, who was tried as

# **Death of a Rancher in Texas Is Attributed to 'Killer Bees'**

**HARLINGEN, Tex., July 19 (AP) —** Federal agricultural officials say the honeybees that killed an 82-year-old rancher last week were the Africanized variety known as killer bees. "Our lab has confirmed it,"

"Our lab has confirmed that the bees are Africanized," said Kim Kaplan, a spokeswoman for the Federal Department of Agriculture in Greenbelt, Md. Final autopsy results are not yet available, but the pathologist who did the autopsy listed the preliminary cause of death as acute fluid buildup in the lungs caused by insect stings.

If the cause of death is confirmed, the rancher, Lino Lopez, would be the first person killed in the United States by an organized bees massive variety migrating in 1990. Harlingen, from the Mexican


